

MAY 2021 NEWSLETTER

It has been another busy month with the NZIFSA AGM in Auckland, two Pre Elementary to Juvenile Skater Development Workshops, two Introduction to Coaching courses, the Level 1 Coaching course getting underway with on-line sessions and online training for Ice Dance Technical Specialists. At the same time we are busy planning for future activities.

DECISION REGARDING HOLLIN'S TROPHY AND SELECTIONS

The Board have reviewed the current situation with regards Hollins Trophy as a Selection competition and wish to advise that:

1) Hollins Trophy will not be used as a Selection and Prioritisation competition in 2021.

The NZIFSA are aware that selection competitions are at the forefront of your mind as we move closer to the competitive season. The current New Zealand Government travel advice is to not travel overseas, with the exception of Australia, where the government advice is to "exercise increased caution" and we now have two way quarantine travel to most parts of Australia. However, we are aware of the increased uncertainty and risk around travel to Australia as a result of COVID-19. Further to this, Ice Skating Australia (ISA) have released information to their skating community discouraging Inter-State competitions. ISA are advising skaters to be careful when booking airfares and accommodation for interstate competitions and is taking no responsibility for any losses. ISA are instead pursuing a strategy of online Benchmark events. While not prohibiting skaters from attending inter-state events, they are discouraging and providing an alternative. NZIFSA respect their moves to limit interstate travel and have decided that Hollin's Trophy will not be used as a Selection competition this year.

2) Provision of a separate selection competition in New Zealand to replace Hollins this year will be investigated by NZIFSA. Such a competition will be dependent on availability of officials and ice time and both of these are in short supply. We expect to be able to advise whether this is an option or not by mid-May. Note, if it did prove possible to hold such an event it would only be open to those that were eligible for International Selection - i.e. currently skating Basic Novice or up and who met the criteria at our 2020 National Championships for selection to a representative level (e.g. Australian Figure Skating Championships or International) and who meet the ISU age requirements for the respective grade.

3) Priority order for selection to compete at International Competitions. If we do not hold an alternative Selection competition, priority order for selection to compete at international competitions is based on the results at our 2020 National Championships. 4) While NZIFSA discourage international travel, we will not prohibit skaters from attending competitions. As noted above, the New Zealand Government advice is to avoid international

travel, excepting Australia, where the government advice is to "exercise increased caution". Skaters still need to seek permission to attend any overseas competitions via the General Secretary, and should allow more time so that discussions can be had regarding the skaters awareness and assessment of the risks. Please note that any attendance at such competitions is at the risk of the participants, with no liability on the NZIFSA. Anyone considering international travel to attend competitions needs to consider very carefully the risks associated with such travel and be aware that COVID-19 related disruption to travel is not covered by travel insurance.

Sport NZ have prepared information for National Sporting Organisations regarding international travel for high performance sports. APPROVAL IS REQUIRED FOR <u>ALL</u> COMPETITIONS OUTSIDE NEW ZEALAND

This is a reminder that skaters must have written approval from NZIFSA before they enter any overseas competition (Rules & Regs 209.9 c). This is even more important if you are considering entering one of the "virtual" competitions that we have seen promoted recently. Some of these events do not appear to have been sanctioned by their national organization or the ISU and include an open invitation to skaters who do not necessarily belong to ISU member federations. Skaters participating in these events risk being ruled ineligible for any NZIFSA or ISU sanctioned events. Can you please ensure that you request permission from NZIFSA by emailing <u>secretary@nzifsa.org.nz</u> before considering entering any events.

High Performance Director – this position is currently vacant, and the Board is not intending to appoint anyone to this role at the moment.

As part of the AGM the Board presented a remit to change the NZIFSA Constitution to formalise the Administrative Support Officer and Technical Support Officer roles that have been filled by ad. hoc. appointments to the Operations Group for the past two to three years, and to include the role of Privacy Officer as part of addressing the requirements of the Privacy Act 2020.

The AGM is also an opportunity to recognise the significant ongoing voluntary contribution of those that keep the Association running. A special thank you to all our NZIFSA Office Bearers for their time and effort they put in. The AGM is also a chance to acknowledge the contribution of those that are stepping back from their roles.

We would like to extend a very special thank you to Anita Tamepo. Anita had been our President since April 2017. Anita's endless commitment and consideration whilst in this role, ensured that skaters best interests were always front and centre of the decision-making process. Anita's knowledge and experience will certainly be missed around the Board table. Unfortunately, Anita had to step back from her role to care for family members in 2020. Vice President, Grant Howie, capably took on the responsibilities of President during this time.

We would also like to acknowledge the contributions of **Simone Thornett** as Coaching Director. A big thank you for the effort and time you have contributed over the past year. It's not any easy role to take on.

NZIFSA MEMBER FORUMS

Three Member Forums were held following the AGM.

- Future Plans. Members shared their ideas for raising the profile of the sport and increasing participation. Winter Games can we convince them to accept us back? Is a gala at Nationals an option? Communicate info re. NCEA credits for skating. Synchro can we address gap in age groups for young adults? Coach skills shortage, can we get coaches on skills list?
- **Privacy Policy**. Clubs need to be aware that they are required to have a Privacy Policy and appoint a Privacy Officer. The Board are in the final stages of providing guiding documents to support Clubs.
- Tests and Competitions NZIFSA has updated the Competition Checklist and Guidelines for clubs and sub associations. These can be found on the T&C page of the members area of our website. We are also working on updating the Website Administration for Clubs information and looking to develop a Checklist and Guidelines for Test Sessions. We will advise clubs when these are available.
